



BIRTHDAY PINWHEEL

You'll need:

- Big Cake Stamp (F-8563)
- 2 — One-sided 6" x 6" patterned papers
- 2 — 6" x 6" cardstock
- 2 — 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" white cardstock
- 3" x 3" pink cardstock
- 2 — Small Beads
- Hole punch
- Wire
- Wooden skewer
- Copic Markers
- Stickles Glitter Glue
- Removable and Repositionable Tape
- Circle nestabilities or 2" punch
- Scalloped circle nestabilities or 2 1/2" punch
- VersaFine Onyx Black ink
- Ribbon
- Paper piercer
- X-Acto Knife
- Glue Dot and 3D Foam Tape

September PROJECT OF THE MONTH

- 1** Glue 6" x 6" patterned papers to matching cardstock.
- 2** Print out the template provided and use repositionable tape to adhere it to the top of the first paper square. Cut around the template edges. Once cut, punch the holes where indicated. (*See Template*) Do the same with the other paper square. (*Note: Make sure you place the template on the same side as the first.*)
- 3** Place a small amount of glue on the round part of the paper. Rotate the second paper 45 degrees and place on top with the same pattern facing up.
- 4** Punch or cut a circle from the white cardstock. Use the VersaFine ink to stamp the Cake. Let dry and color with markers. Embellish with Stickles.
- 5** Use the scalloped die or punch on the pink cardstock. Use the paper piercer to pierce two holes side by side in the center. Run the wire through the holes then thread both ends of wire through the bead.
- 6** Take the pinwheel and fold in each arm lining up holes with the center hole. Run the wired scalloped circle through it. Then place the wire through the 2nd bead.

7 Place your wooden skewer between the wires and twist. To better secure the pinwheel to the skewer you might want to add some sticky tape or glue dot to the back. Or you can use the Exacto Blade to carefully cut notches into the skewer for the wire to sit in. To hide the glue and wire, punch out a small circle from the remaining cardstock and add to the back.

8 Adhere your stamped image to scalloped circle with foam tape. Tie your ribbon onto the skewer in a bow or streamer.
